About the program

Now in its 12th year, the Avant Early Career Research Program (formerly known as the Doctor in Training Research Scholarship Program) has supported life-changing research to promote better patient outcomes and advance the careers of some of Australia's promising medical researchers.

Started in response to the difficulties early career doctors face in securing research funding, the program has so far awarded 176 scholarships worth over \$4.3 million. These scholarships have supported research across a wide range of topics, including organ transplantation, epidemiology, hepatology, oncology, obstetrics, cardiology and general surgery.

The program aims to inspire confidence and empower early career researchers by providing support through research funding, coaching and skills development and to be the leading research partner in Australia for early career doctors.

In 2023, Avant will offer up to \$450,000 in funding across a total of 29 different grants designed to support early career doctors at different stages of their research careers.



Full-time grants

Full-time grants (\$50,000) must be conducted on a full-time basis, usually over a 12-month period.



Part-time grants

Part-time grants (\$25,000), usually conducted over a 12-month period.



Short-term grants

Short-term grants providing financial assistance (\$12,500) for short-term research projects.



Microgrants

Small grants (\$5,000) to support pre-clinical trial work such as a literature or systematic review or a small pilot piece of research to test a concept. Microgrant recipients will also receive coaching from previous Avant grant recipients.



Skills Development courses

These courses aim to provide the skill sets essential to evaluating evidence, understanding biostatistics, and beginning clinical research careers.

Who can apply?

Applicants for research grants must be:

- an Avant member with one of the following professional indemnity insurance policies with Avant Insurance Limited:
 - Intern
 - Resident Medical Officer
- Doctor in Training
- an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia
- registered with the Medical Board of Australia
- · enrolled in:
 - a specialist research training program recognised and approved by a relevant Australian/Australasian college and accredited by the Australian Medical Council (specialist in training), or
 - a research program with a recognised academic institution working towards a post-graduate degree such as a masters or PhD, or

- a formal research program with at least one appropriately qualified research supervisor, with research commencing on or before 31 March 2024.

Applicants for skills development courses only need to be an Avant member.

Non-members

Non-members are not eligible for this program but if you join Avant before the application close date, you will be immediately eligible. Check which category is best for you and join online at **avant.org.au/join**. Once your membership is confirmed you can then complete a grant application.

Application process

Applications must be made through the online form at avantdifference.org. au/early-career-research-program

Please ensure the information provided is detailed and complete. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

Selection is based on the following information:

- personal details
- education
- previous work experience
- · past research
- · research project
- research team and supervisor
- adherence to specific project evaluation criteria (eg social impact and technology).

You will need to indicate your research category and type, and whether you are applying for a grant or skills development course. There is a word limit for each section.





Further information

Judging

An independent panel of leading medical practitioners will review all the information provided on your application form. An interview may also be requested.

The criteria for evaluation varies based on the type of award but generally considers your personal information and curriculum vitae including previous research outputs, leadership experience, the research team in which you are working and the proposed research itself, including the experimental design, its significance, expected outcomes and translatability.

Successful recipients for the fulltime, part-time and short-term grants will be advised via phone in October 2023, followed by written confirmation.

Presentation dinner

All grant recipients will be invited to attend a presentation dinner and should agree to be photographed and be included in articles for marketing and promotional purposes.

Payment of awards

All grant recipients will be expected to comply with the terms and conditions of the program, which set out what you need to do to receive payments. You can read them online at avantdifference.org.au/early-career-research-program

Payment of full and part-time grants may be made in three instalments, subject to satisfactory progress:

- first instalment of 50% paid on commencement of the research
- second instalment of 25% paid midway through the research
- third instalment of 25% paid on completion of the research.

Payment of short-term and microgrants will be in two instalments, subject to satisfactory progress:

- first instalment of 50% paid on commencement of the research
- second instalment of 50% paid on completion of the research.

Enrolment fees for the skills development courses will be paid directly to the course provider.
